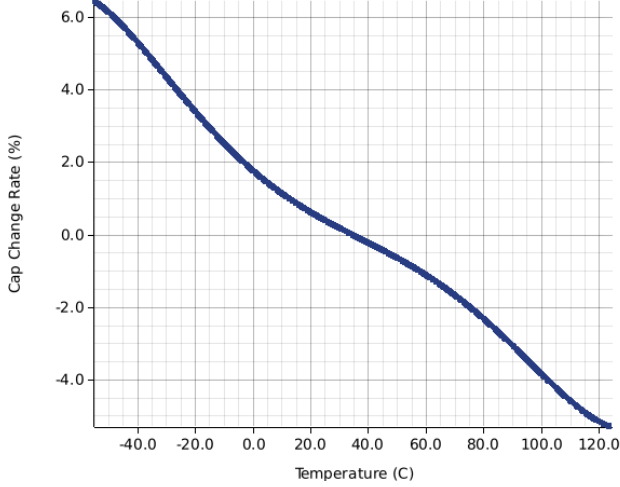

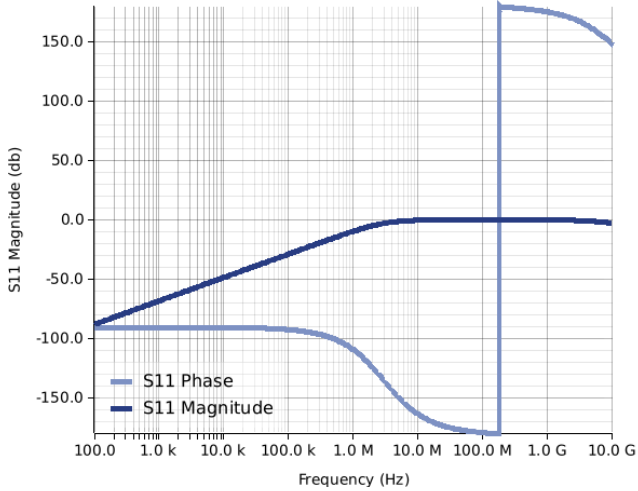
Capacitance Change vs. Temperature



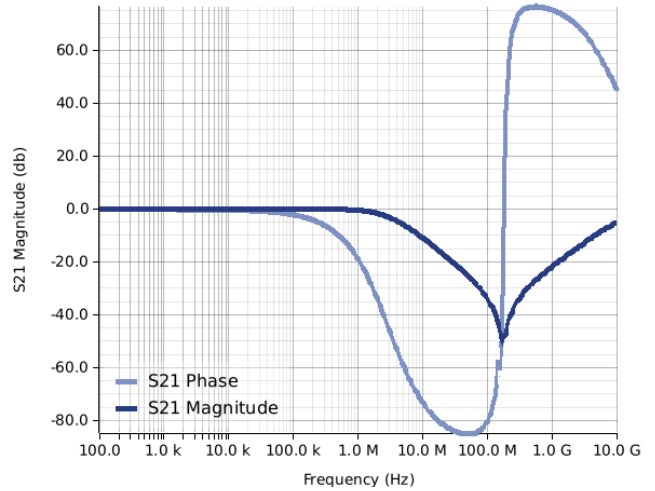
Capacitance Change vs. AC Voltage
